

LESSON PLAN

Subject: History

Topic: Reformation

Age of students: 16 - 17

Language level: B2

Time: 45/60 minutes

Content aims:

After completing the lesson, the student will be able to:

Describe the history of the Catholic church.

Explain what the heresy is.

Determine the causes of the Reformation.

Determine at least two positive and two negative consequences of the Reformation.

Compare the Schism of the 11th century with the Reformation of the 16th century.

Compare formation and basic features of Reformation, Protestantism, Calvinism, Anglicanism, Puritanism and Evangelism.

Write an essay about good and bad sides of Reformation.

Language aims:

After completing the lesson, the student will be able to:

Use essential vocabulary about the Reformation.

Use correctly new vocabulary through definitions of different churches.

Orally introduce information about the lesson.

Express a personal opinion about good and bad sides of Reformation.

Procedure:

1. Recalling about the of the Christ's teachings, about the Catholic church and it's heresies.

Enouncing topic of the lesson.

Watching a movie about Martin Luther and Reformation - 15 minutes

Analysis of the movie – teacher asks questions from the questionnaire, notes pupils comprehension of the movie, interprets what is unclear and explains unfamiliar words.



Questionnaire

1. What did Martin Luther do before he became a priest?
2. Why did he become a priest?
3. Why did he disagree with the Catholic Church?
4. What did he do about it?
5. Why did Luther preach about salvation of the human soul?
6. What did Pope and Charles V say about 95 theses?
7. How did he spread his ideas?
8. Which book he translated in German?
9. Why were new churches created after Luther's Reformation? What were their names?

Unfamiliar words: Indulgence, Reformation, Protestantism, Calvinism, Anglicanism, Puritan, Evangelism, 95 Theses, *Fidei Defensor*, Religious Peace.

2. Teacher explains about Anglicanism, Calvinism and Puritans (formation and basic features)

3. Homework - An essay about good and bad sides of Reformation.
